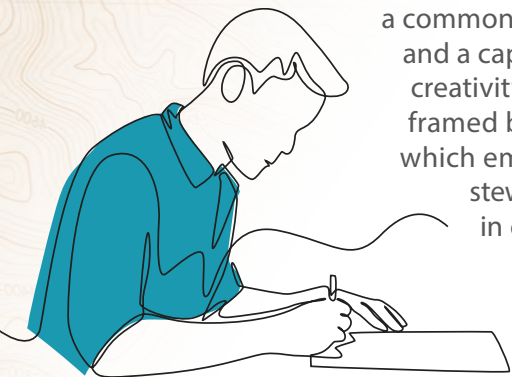


ENHANCING COMMUNICATION SKILLS

This course builds on grade 11 grammar with advanced topics such as passive participles. Students will strengthen their writing skills through a variety of assignments, including descriptive essays, research reports, literary analyses, sonnets, memoirs, and critical film reviews. Emphasizing voice, structure, and audience awareness, students will engage in the full writing process—from planning and drafting to revising and publishing. Interactive workshops and mentor-text analysis refine writing, revision, and critical thinking. A capstone project, including a research paper, presentation, and reflection, enhances research and communication skills. New assignments, such as a critical film review, a commonplace book presentation, and a capstone presentation foster creativity and analysis. All work is framed by a biblical worldview, which emphasizes truth, craft, stewardship, and perseverance in communication.



How We Teach It

Writing Projects & Grammar

Students tackle a variety of writing assignments—research papers, literary analyses, a critical film review, sonnets, a memoir, and an editorial—designed to develop their voice, structure, and audience awareness while guiding them through the full writing process. Students will continue to demonstrate proficiency with English grammar and style through targeted exercises. Practice the Skill, Use the Skill, and grammar reviews help reinforce key concepts.

Mentor-Text Analysis

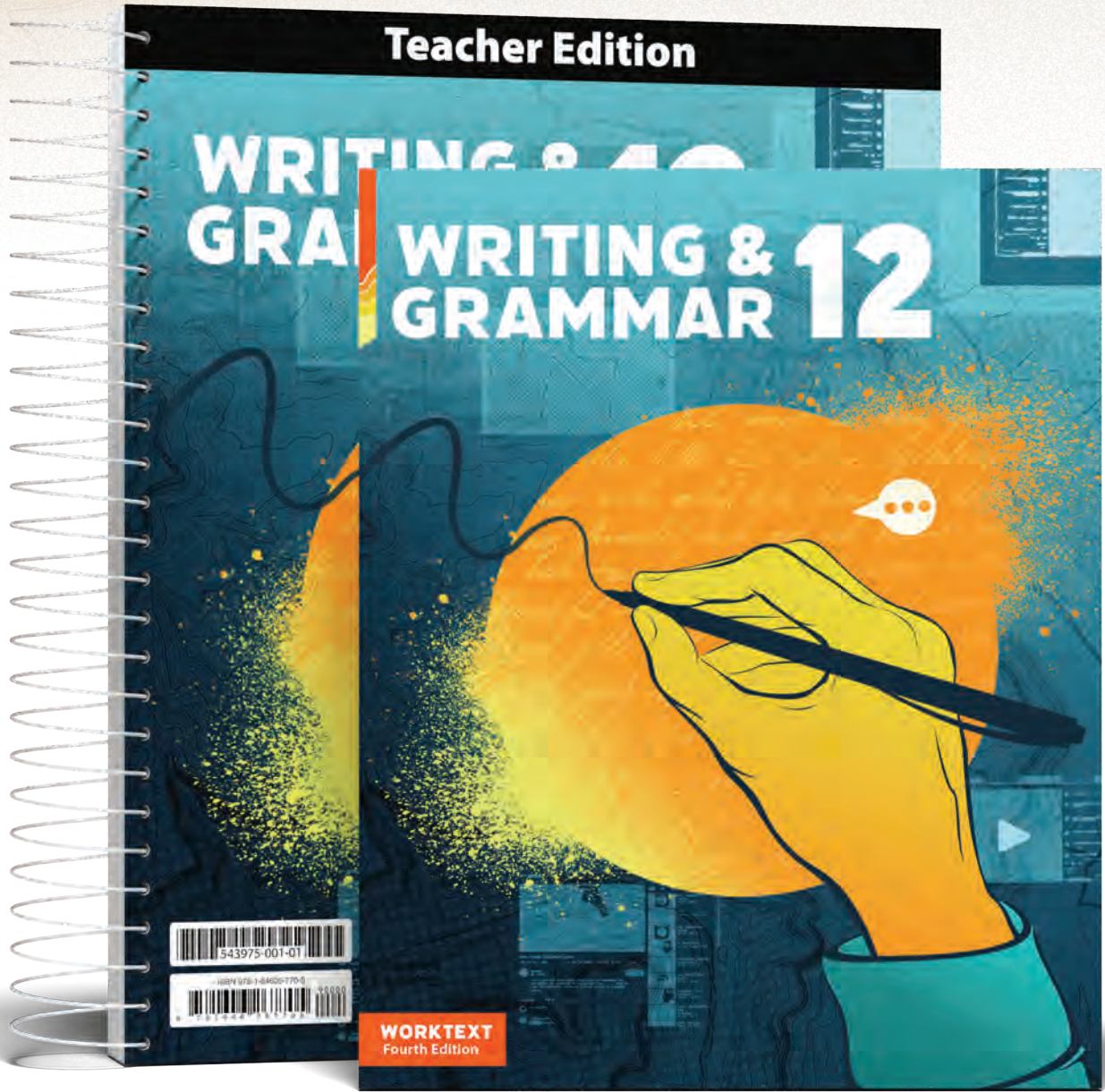
Students examine full-length mentor texts that model effective writing strategies across genres, providing them with practical techniques to apply to their own work.

Collaborative Learning

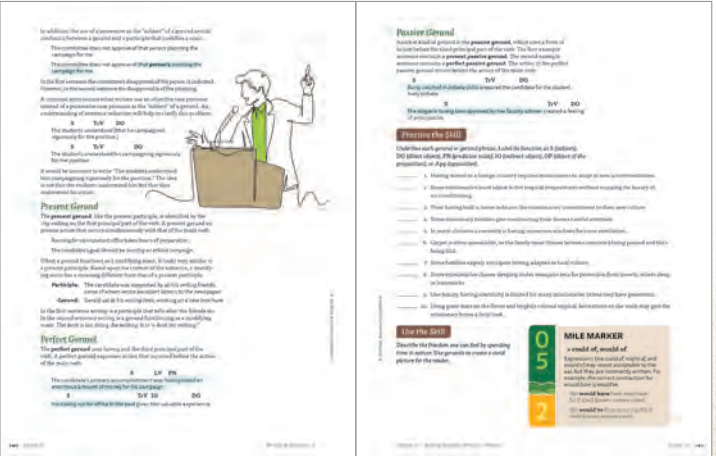
Class discussions, group activities, and peer review sessions encourage deeper engagement with writing and grammar concepts. These collaborative activities improve critical thinking and problem-solving skills.

Materials

Student Worktext

The *Writing & Grammar 12* Student Worktext offers in-depth explanations of key grammar concepts—such as parts of speech, phrases and clauses, tense sequences, and perfect verb forms. The students will engage in major writing assignments that will foster understanding of difficult grammatical concepts.
